## NOTES FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

This is the first series of notes about the financial status of the Parish and School. The Finance Committee is writing to tell you where “we” are, where we are going and what the parish needs to do to continue our operations.

### WHERE WE ARE: SCHOOL

For the last few years St. Lawrence Parish has lost over \$100,000 per year on the operation of the School. We are quickly burning through the savings accumulated in the past.

Several approaches have been tried to stem the tide. In the 2008-09 year, teacher positions were cut and the salaries of the entire school faculty were frozen. For 2009-10, we expanded the number of EdChoice students (state vouchers), and raised the nominal tuition to \$4,400 to take full advantage of the state payments. However, the number of EdChoice registrations has not met our projection (resulting in a loss of \$70,000), and the State, with its own budget shortfall, cut back its payment limits (an additional loss of \$23,000).

### WHERE WE ARE: BINGO

The Sunday and Tuesday Bingos have traditionally been the largest single activity supporting our St. Lawrence School. Just four years ago the bingo contributed \$305,180, which was nearly \$1,300 per student. However, this past year the net receipts fell to \$172,910, or about \$750 per student. This year’s net receipts look to be about the same as last.

What has happened? The economy? The no-smoking regulations? Changing demographics? A lack of bingo workers?

There is a dedicated core group, who week in and week out organize the bingo operation. But they need assistance from school parents and other willing volunteers, who can help out just one Sunday or Tuesday per month. If we could get Bingo back to the level of 4 years ago, many of our financial issues would be eased.

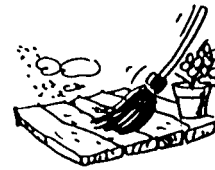
