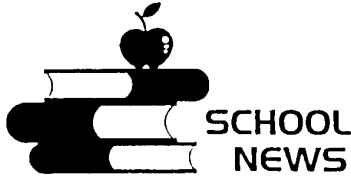
Seton High School takes science seriously! Students can take part in one of two science camps hosted at Seton this summer.
