Eucharistic Adoration is Thursdays from 3:00pm to 5:00pm. During part of the time, from about 3:25pm to 3:55pm, I will hear confessions.

Mass Changes-The First Sunday of Advent: Many of you are already aware that we will begin using the New Roman Missal on the First Sunday of Advent. The New Missal will be more formal in language and scripturally richer in images. Some of the words in the Gloria, Creed, Holy, Holy, Holy and Memorial Acclamations will be different. There will be a few changes in your responses.

At this time, the Archbishop has given us permission to learn and use the new sung parts of the Mass, such as the Holy, Holy and the Lamb of God.

In your pews are little red booklets with the music and words for the Mass of Redemption and the Chant Mass in English. Mr. Schaedle and Mrs. Rogers will be rehearsing the new music with you, about ten minutes before the Masses at 4:30, 9:00 and 11:00. Also, as we get closer to the first Sunday of Advent, I will place in the pews Mass cards that contain all of the new translations and wordings that we will use. You will also find all of the new translations and wordings in the missalettes beginning with the first Sunday of Advent.

PLEASE NOTE: We want to keep the red booklets, Mass cards and hymn books in a neat and orderly manner in the pews, so please remember to do the following.

AFTER EACH MASS: 1. For those who sit in the center pews: place the red booklets and Mass cards at the **ENDS** (near the aisles) of each pew and place the Gather and red hymn books at the dividers in the center of the pews.

2. For those who sit in the side pews: place the red booklets and Mass cards at the **ENDS** (near the aisles) of each pew and place the Gather and red hymn books at the ends of the pews under the windows. **THANK YOU!**
