The Archdiocesan Lay Pastoral Ministry Program has been educating and forming lay men and women just like you since 1975 for service to their parishes, schools and communities. Elder High School: In order to give students more flexibility in scheduling classes, Elder will offer two first-time credit courses this summer. Courses offered are: **Health:** This is an online course for students currently in grades 8-11. Students will meet at Elder for approximately one hour on Monday, June 11 at 7:45am to meet teachers and obtain class information and the textbook. They will also meet at Elder approximately one hour on Friday June 29 at 7:45am to take the final test and return the textbook. Students must have access to email and a computer to complete this course. Fee is \$300.

Physical Education: This PE course is open to students currently in grades 8-11. The course may require students to make arrangements for transportation to off campus sites and pay a minimal additional fee for a few activities. The majority of activities will take place on Elder's campus. The course will meet daily from 7:45am-11:30am from June 11-June 29. Fee for the course is \$300.

Students who successfully pass these courses would receive high school credit. The acceptance of the credit is determined by the individual high school.
